Strongly discouraged, but if there is a valid excuse arrangements must be made before the rally begins for a horse to leave. Team members are encouraged to stay and support their team.

Competitor Ratings At Rallies:

Competitors will now be judged in HM based on their highest HM rating. This must be included on the documentation provided to rally organizers.

Feed charts and feeding:

The 2010 Horse Management Rule Book has a very good expanded section on how to label feed and prepare a feed chart. HM 13 - Feed and Feeding, pages 22-24.

Vet Letters:

There is a new vet letter form, 2010 Horse Management Rule Book, Appendix F, page 99. It <u>must</u> be presented to the Chief before briefing.

Required Equipment:

Appendix H, Required Equipment List Amplifications, is now RULES.

Shall/Must - an enforceable rule Should - a recommendation

Examples:

- First Aid Kits and the Utility Kit <u>must</u> be stored so they are readily available in case of an emergency.
- Extra equipment <u>must</u> be clean/conditioned to the Standard of Proficiency for Turnout Inspection of the highest rated rider on the team, so it is ready to be used at a moment's notice by any team member.)
- There are a few items <u>must</u> be hung by the door of the Tack Room:
 - Working flashlight
 - "A" or "ABC" Fire Extinguisher, and
 - Team or Individual Identification Sign.
- For health reasons each mount <u>must</u> have their own hoof pick
- Sponges should be neat and reasonably clean. Store wet sponges in sponge drying rack. They <u>must</u> be marked to indicate which is for the dock and which is for the face.
- Feed tubs/buckets: Must be: Heavy-duty.
- Extra bridles must be complete and assembled.

Things to check before your first rally:

Human First Aid Kit:

Triple Antibiotic Cream MUST have a current expiration date. Please put lots of disposable gloves in the Human First Aid Kit.

Equine First Aid Kit:

Topical Antibacterial/Antimicrobial/Antibiotic Agent MUST have a current expiration date. One pound roll absorbent cotton is getting very difficult to find Epsom salts are not required anymore Please use digital thermometers Antibacterial/antimicrobial/antiseptic scrubs can be Dial 'antibacterial' soaps.

Tack Cleaning Kit:

Boot polishing kit is back in

Grooming:

Wash buckets should be at least two gallons and marked 'Wash Only'

Biggest points lost in Required Equipment:

No boot trees and/or toes Broken pony club pins Broken jackknife (very dangerous) Passed expiration dates

Stall cards: No Chaperone name/number. Make sure every team member knows who their chaperone is and has their cell number on the stall card.

HM Rule Changes: Grooma's are now allowed. But just have every member buy a concentric ring rubber curry comb and stick it in their grooming kit.
