Mock H-B Test - Are You Ready for the H-B Certification?

H-B Certification Testing May 2-4

The Virginia Region will host an H-B certification testing on May 2-4 at Morningside Training Farm, The Plains. **Registration & payment were due to USPC office by February 7th**. (Late fees apply after Feb 7th.) To register for this test, go to the USPC site at <u>USPC National Tests Info</u> then click on *Application to Test* to submit your application. Click on *Test Fees* to submit your payment. The USPC fee is \$160. The region fee is \$175 and is paid separately. Details for this test (agenda, start times, etc) will be provided to all applicants prior to the test.



HM Handbook Gets Updates

From Clair Harmon, Vice President of Instruction: The Horse Management Committee has been working very hard on the new Horse Management Handbook. It has taken a little longer than expected and is currently being reviewed by the Instruction Council and PAC. It should be approved and released shortly. This being the case, we realize that Rallies are fast approaching and that the members and the officials need time to read and understand the new handbook.

In an effort to help both the members and officials, if you have a Rally in March or April use the current Horse Management Handbook and newsletter. All Rallies beginning May 1st will use the 2014 Horse Management Handbook and Newsletter. The HM Handbook will be available online and for purchase through ShopPonyClub.org.

On **March 18th at 8pm**, USPC is offering a webinar to introduce the new Handbook. Check out <u>this link</u> for more information or to sign up.

Note: Those Qualifying for Championships under the current HM Handbook will be judged according to the 2014 HM Handbook at Championships in July of 2014.

USPC Championships and Festival - Coming Soon to the Kentucky Horse Park, Lexington, Kentucky!



USPC Championships 2014, will be held in Lexington, KY. "Champs" will be from July 14-18, with "Festival" immediately following from July 19-21.

Our Champs Coordinator, Lisa Woods, is hard at working pulling everything together to make this a wonderful event for our Regional participants.

Qualifying criteria can be found on the <u>USPC website</u>, with discipline specific qualifications, in each discipline's rulebook and newsletters. Be sure to note **age** and **certification** requirements for attending champs, and additional qualification requirements for Eventing.

As we go through the rally season, Lisa will update the list of "qualifiers" on our Virginia Region website, under "Rallies", "Championships", "2014 Qualifiers". The list of qualifiers grows with the completion of each qualifying rally, so be sure to check to see your name on the list! Once qualified it is important to let Lisa know as soon as possible if you are interested in going to Champs in that discipline. Our Virginia Region teams are formed based on the rankings from rally results. The Virginia Region team spots will be filled by those that qualify with first through fourth places. If an individual chooses not to go, or opts for a different discipline, we will go down the list to the next qualifiers. Even if you qualified last, don't fret! You might still be able to get on a team. Typically we can only send one team per discipline, per division, however, traditionally, we have always been able to send scramble members. The key is to let us know that you want to go!! The earlier, the better!

Regarding Stable Managers, it seems we are always scrambling for them at the last minute. Stable Managers are an integral part of each team, and "SMing" is a great way to attend Champs without the extra stress of bringing a horse along, and it's much more affordable! Please consider "SMing" for VRPC this year at Champs!

Lisa has just posted the Information Sheet and this year's forms on the Virginia Region website (except the Polo Shirt Order Form). You can fill out the Intent to Compete Form online this year if you wish! Or, download the snail mail version.

We will again hold a mandatory "Picnic Prep" for members planning to go to Championships. This is scheduled for Sunday, June 29, location TBD. This prep is extremely important and helpful for parents and members to get to know their teammates and plan who will bring equipment. It's also important and helpful to have "veterans" of

champs there to help our newer participants figure it all out.

VRPC is looking into hiring a horse transport to get our horses to Kentucky. We used Brook Ledge the last time Champs was held in Kentucky and it worked well for those that used the service.

Lisa has reserved a block of 40 rooms at the Holiday Inn in Georgetown, Kentucky, not far from the horse park. The "secret code" to reserve a room will be released when you complete your intent to compete and pay your registration.

The VRPC closing date for Champs is June 16, 2014. This is the Monday after Eventing Rally. All paperwork and payments are due to the Champs Coordinator by that date.

It is important to note that since Champs is in KY this year, a Health Certificate is required for each horse traveling outside the state of Virginia. Health Certificates are obtained from your vet, good for 30 days and must cover the duration of travel.

Wise Words From Moose Man... Reduce Your HM Score

In Pony Club Horse Management, scoring is like playing golf... you want a low score.

Read the discipline and the Horse Management rulebooks. Knowing the



rules is your best defense of avoiding points in the first place and getting them back in inquiries/protests. The rulebooks look kinda thick, but much of that is for officials, etc. and you can breeze thru.

Know the inquiry and protest procedures. HM Rulebook HM 17. Do not miss the inquiry period. Drop by the HM office on your way to the ring to see if scores will be posted soon. You only have 30 minutes from when the scores are posted. If you get a point and honestly feel you should not be getting the point, do not be afraid to inquire it. Chiefs LOVE to talk to competitors. Do not inquire every point. Chiefs do not love to talk THAT much! A goal of Pony Club and HM is to teach the members to not be afraid to talk to "authority figures." Go in with a smile on your face and a good attitude and explain your side. If there is not a rule about it, you should not be getting a point!

Watch each other's backs. Check the stable area before you leave and at intervals during the day. Stall doors closed? Halters hung up? Stuff left out? Stalls clean? Water buckets clean and full? Wheelbarrow, and cleaning tools stowed and secured? Muck in a barrow? Yuck! Is your competitor number on the stall card?

Have a good attitude even if the going gets rough. Pull together. Teamwork! Support each other, and help other teams that may be struggling. We love to see teamwork!

Do not be afraid to ask HM's opinion. If you get an opinion that something is OK from an HM, you cannot be given a point for it.

Turnout - Do not be late! Before turnout, run your hands all over every inch of your pony. This is what we do at turnout. If you do not feel any dirt, we will not either. Just before, pick feet, and wipe eyes, nose and dock. Read your section of the turnout sheet (HM Form #3A, B, C as appropriate) and see what the requirements are.

Tackrooms - Sometimes they will be a work in progress, but we hope there does not come to be a pattern of messiness. Empty your garbage can at night. Tidy up before you head to lunch or leave the grounds.

Required Equipment - Do NOT trust mom to check the kits. Mom will not be given the points. You will! EVERYTHING on the Required Equipment list must be labeled.

Feedrooms - Close the feed room door! Always tie hay bales back up. Make sure the feed container is secured.

That's all for now!
