Teams: 3 or 4 riders and one Stable Manager (SM). D3 and above, will allow D2 with DC's approval.

DCs/CAs must determine that members are safe to compete at chosen level, given the

technical nature of show jumping courses.

Divisions: Competitors may enter Qualifying or Non-Qualifying divisions based on the horse/rider

ability, desire to go to Championships and DC/CA approval.

Qualifying divisions for Standard and Modified Championships (may all be ridden as

non-qualifying if a member does not wish to go to Championships.

VRPC ranking criteria for Championships selection are based on the competitor's scores in rounds 1-3 (jump off score not included) and their Horse Management score. Power and Speed (P&S) (round 4), will not be scored or included in Championships selection. P&S is offered to provide an opportunity for competitors to ride a P&S round, which is included at Championships. In the last qualifying round, the Intermediate Division will include a two stride combination of two verticals which will be included at Championships.

Division offered at regional rally but not offered at USPC Championships

All non-qualifying level competitors will jump four numbered rounds. They will not have a jump-off or a Two Phase (aka Power and Speed) round.

NQ1 horse or pony 2'0'' - 2'3'' (will be same course as Intermediate level, just reduced heights)

Competitors attempting to qualify for Championships must meet the following age and certification requirements:

Standard Intermediate	12 years or older	C-1 EV/HSE and up
Modified Novice	10 years or older	D-2 EV/HSE and up

Standard Advanced	12 years or older	C-1 EV/HSE and up
Modified Stable Manager	10 years or older	D-2 H-M and up
Standard Stable Manager	12 years or older	D-3 H-M and up

Qualifications for Standard / Modified championships:

Members attempting to qualify in Novice or Advanced (Low, Medium High Jumpers) must complete a Two Phase (aka Power and Speed) round.; however, the round will not be scored or considered a qualifying round.

VRPC ranking criteria for Championships selection are based on the competitor's scores in rounds 1-3 (jump off score not included) and their Horse Management score. Power and Speed (P&S) (round 4), will not be scored or included in Championships selection. P&S is offered to provide an opportunity for competitors to ride a P&S round, which is included at Championships. In the last qualifying round, the Intermediate Division will include a two stride combination of two verticals which will be included at Championships.

Fees:

Entry fee \$150 per VRPC competitor; \$200 per out-of-region competitor.

Cost includes stabling Friday evening through the end of the rally Sunday.

No straw bedding allowed, shavings only (not provided unless pre-purchased during registration). No fee for Stable Managers. Out of region competitors use code OutofRegion when registering online.

Payment:

Check with your club/center on payment policy. Online payment method is required!!

Riding Center members may pay independently but Club members should follow their club policy and pay ONLY if the club has directed you to do so. Otherwise forward your invoice to appropriate club contact.

Important Notes Regarding Invoices and Payments:

- Invoices and payment receipts are generated by the system and emailed to the member during the registration process.
- Entries must be paid by May 8th or a 20% late fee will be added.

Refund Policies:

Refunds follow VRPC policy as indicated on the VRPC website.

Entry/Registration:

Online http://vrponyclub.org/ using VRPC member's email address or code OutofRegion for an out-of-region competitor. Click on Calendar (May), then Show Jumping Rally – Individual Registration button. Follow directions on-screen for Individual Registration, Chaperone Form, Payment Information, etc. Please note there is a separate link in the calendar for Individual competitor vs. Stable Manager entries. Please select the appropriate link.

Please scan and upload documents during the registration process. Any updates after registration, please email to you club's Rally Coordinator:

- 1. Current negative Coggins for each mount (name must match entered mount)
- 2. USPC Coaching Guidelines and Form, signed by coaches uploaded during Team/Scrambler registration (in Forms section of VRPC website)

Volunteers: Minimum of three volunteers per team entry is required.

One volunteer will serve as the team Chaperone, in addition to their other volunteer responsibilities.

One volunteer per team must be designated as Horse Management.

Minimum of one volunteer per scramble entry is required for this Rally
