

Casanova-Warrenton Pony Club Camp June 25-29, 2018 INFO SHEET

Location: Glenwood Park 36787 Glenwood Park Lane, Middleburg VA 20117

Schedule: Move-in Sunday, June 24 4:00-6:00PM Move in equipment, set up stalls, tents and tack rooms. Campers and ponies traveling a distance may stable and camp Sunday night with prior permission. Contact, cwpcdc@gmail.com
Campers participating in the Certification Testing on Sunday may also stable pony in their assigned stall for camp Sunday. Stalls will be assigned and posted for move in. Up to 4 campers will share feed/tack stall. One-way traffic NO TRAILERS on the lane close to the barn for UNLOADING only or bring a wheelbarrow to carry equipment and supplies from the parking field. Please do so quickly, so others may also move in. Park truck and trailer in designated field. Set up your stall for pony's comfort first. Then, put tack and feed away. Set up your tent last in designated area only.

Monday, June 24, 7:00AM Horses arrive. **8:00AM** Camper briefing. **9:00AM** Lessons begin

Overnight camping will be on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday nights.

Bring your own tent or share with a friend. Meals will be prepared and served by parent volunteers.

Thursday, June 25, 2:00PM Recognition party with parents, then move out.

Parent camp volunteer commitments: Parents are asked to provide meal items and to camp overnight as a chaperone, if possible, for one night and/or volunteer as parent of the day by sign up on registration form.

CWPC's fundraisers, Twilight Polo, Jumpers, and Great Meadow International gate volunteers, subsidizes camp. Bring the family to enjoy free entry to an evening of exciting polo while parent and camper work a gate shift directing traffic, handing out programs and collecting the parking fee from polo guests. Please schedule your volunteer time through the Sign Up Genius invitation link on the camp registration form.

What to Bring to Camp For Your Pony

Mark all belongings with your first and last name with a permanent marking pen.

1. Feed pre-measured in paper bags with the pony's name, camper's name, and feed time (Mon)day AM/PM for each meal and stored in a metal can. A chain or rope must be attached tightly across the top so that a pony cannot get into it.
2. Completed Stall Card with picture of pony.
3. Feed bin and snaps, screw eyes, and /or bailing twine hang in stall
4. 2—5 gallon water buckets and snaps, screw eyes, and /or bailing twine hang in stall
5. 1—5 gallon top off bucket marked top off to be placed outside the stall at night
6. Hay—enough for all days with your name and your pony's name labeled on tape on the twine
7. Salt block in feed bucket or attached with twine to the stall
8. Leather halter or breakaway halter and cotton lead rope
9. Pitch fork, rake/broom, and muck bucket or wheelbarrow
10. Box Fan and extension cord
11. Grooming Kit, all items labeled with owners name.
12. Wash bucket marked with your name and wash only, sponge, and sweat scraper
13. Tack—clean and in good repair with necessary pads, including an extra saddle pad for second ride of the day if the other is wet. Crop, dressage whip if desired.
14. Tack Cleaning kit, see *USPC Horse Management Rulebook* required equipment list
15. Tack hooks, saddle rack

What to Bring to Camp For You

1. Pony bathed clean and well conditioned/fit for camp
2. USPC approved helmet and arm band with current USPC Medical Card or bracelet complete to be worn at all times
3. Please wear pony club correct riding attire: britches/jodhpurs (belt with belt loops), polo shirt, boots and helmet for lessons; shirts must have sleeves, no tank tops or camis at any time during camp except at pool
4. Water bottle to fill from water coolers
5. Swimsuit (one piece or modest 2 piece), towel, pool/shower shoes (flip flops). Showers available at pool, bring soap and change of clothes to afternoon pool time, if you wish to bathe.
6. Night wear, appropriate shorts or pants and t-shirts.
7. Appropriate barn shoes or boots, must cover the ankle in barns at all times.
8. Sweatshirt and rain coat
9. Tent, bedroll or sleeping bag, pillow
10. Tent and camp chair
11. Flashlight and/or battery power lantern

12. Your pony club notebook with your flow charts for certification you are working to achieve, paper, pencil
Pony Club members should ask instructors to sign your flow chart.
13. USPC Manual of Horsemanship D or C
14. Personal items, toothbrush, toothpaste, soap towel, bug spray, sun screen, etc.
15. Cross country vest, if you use one; crop; longe line for C candidates
16. For shooting clinic, Air pistol .177 caliber (4.5mm) with soft lead pellets (wadcutter) and shooting goggles. Pistols must be checked in at the jockey house with DC at start of camp and will be stored there at all times. Adult clinician or chaperone will load. Crosman American Classic 1377 air pistols are available at Dick's Sporting Goods for about \$65 if your pony clubber is interested in participating in Tetrathlon Rally.
17. Polocrosse racket, ball, breast plate, polo wraps and joust pole if you have them.
18. Be prepared to share your favorite ground school topic or horsey experience.

CAMP RULES

We have the best instructors, special guest clinicians, dedicated volunteers, and ideal facility for camp!

Please be respectful of the time and expertise they are here to give you. Be respectful of the grounds, structures and equipment at Glenwood Park so that camp will be safe and pleasant for all.

Parents and campers please read the rules so that there are no misunderstandings.

The Camp Director will be happy to answer any questions you may have.

1. Courteous sportsmanlike conduct is expected at all times.
2. Campers are required to follow the schedule and to arrive on time throughout the camp.
Campers must request permission from the Camp Director to be excused from a scheduled activity or to leave camp.
3. Approved riding helmets must be worn at all times when mounted.
Proper footwear and USPC Medical armband or bracelet is required during any activity on or around horses for all campers.
4. Workmanlike clothing and footwear suitable on and around horses is required for all campers and volunteers at all times except at the pool or in sleeping tent: no tank tops, sleeveless tops, short shorts, flip flops, or pajamas.
5. Horse care, conduct, attire, equipment and safety standards during camp will be run in accordance to the *current USPC Horse Management Rulebook*.
6. Possession or use of drugs or alcohol is forbidden. Smoking, possession or use of tobacco at any time is forbidden.
7. Use of motor vehicles (auto, tractor, etc.) except at the direction of the Camp Director is forbidden.
8. Campers must be in their tents, remain quiet with lights out from the scheduled bed time until the scheduled rising hour.
9. Volunteer parents may not bring to camp; younger children that are not registered for camp, extra horses, or pets during volunteer times so that focus remains on registered campers and their safety.
10. Meals plus snacks and drinks will be provided daily during overnight camp. Any food brought to camp must be kept in a tightly-sealed container.
11. Camps may not have visitors, except parents who may come to volunteer or observe the ride times.
12. Campers must remain within the camp area boundaries at all times.
13. No camper may depart from camp with anyone other than a parent or guardian without written parental permission and the knowledge of the Camp Director.
14. Dump all manure into the BACK of the manure area.
15. No one shall sit, stand, touch or place anything on the Glenwood Park Stone Wall of Champions.
16. Parking: Vehicles and horse trailers park in field to right of camp driveway. **No parking on grass shoulders, near the jockey house or near barn area.** Volunteers may unload camp supplies near jockey house then please move vehicle to parking field or grand stand gravel parking area.
18. Camping shall be in designated areas only. Do not set up tents under trees due to thunderstorm danger of falling branches.
17. Leave Glenwood Park in better, cleaner condition than when you arrived. You will pick up trash, my own or trash left by others, and you'll repair or report any damage to the park facilities.
